

Are You Eligible For Publicly Funded Laboratory Testing?

- **Citizens Of Any Other Country**
(except cook islands, Niue or Tokelau)
Student permit holder's
Visitors permit holders
Not eligible for any routine laboratory test funding. However, **Australia and United Kingdom** citizens are eligible in the case of emergency & emergency maternity treatment
- **Citizens Of Cooks Islands, Niue or Tokelau**
Eligible for all laboratory test funding as for New Zealanders
- **Immigration applicants**
Not eligible for any laboratory test funding
- **Overseas Maternity Patients**
(except for cook islands, Niue and Tokelau)
Only eligible if you are lawfully in New Zealand and the partner or spouse of a New Zealand citizen or permanent resident
- **Pre-Employment Checks**
Not eligible for any laboratory test funding
- **Specialist Requested Forms**
Not eligible if you present in Gisborne, Hutt Valley or Wellington with a specialist form from any region in New Zealand
- **Work Permit Holders**
Eligible if your work permit has been issued for a period of two years or more, or have had their work permit renewed that allows for a stay of two consecutive years or more.
